CAMPUS SECURITY AND SAFETY

Everyone has the right to attend Salina Tech in a safe and secure environment. While the College has no formal campus security personnel, it is the duty of the staff and instructors to uphold the Board policies on security as well as abide by College policies, as well as Local, State and Federal laws. The College policies are designed to ensure students, staff and all property are protected at all times from possible damage or injury, outside intrusion or disturbances occurring on campus grounds or in campus buildings.

Clery Act and the Campus Sexual Violation Elimination Act

Salina Tech is committed to providing an atmosphere free of violence for all members of the campus community. In compliance with the Jeanne Clery Act and the Campus Sexual Violence Elimination Act (SaVE Act), Salina Tech does not tolerate: stalking, sexual assault, domestic violence or dating violence.

Salina Tech will pursue the perpetrators of such acts to the fullest extent of the law. Students or employees who are responsible for such acts of violence will be subject to disciplinary action through the Student Services Office or Office of Human Resources. This can include expulsion or termination and criminal prosecution simultaneously.

Salina Tech is also committed to providing safety and support services to victims of stalking, sexual assault, domestic violence or dating violence. This policy applies equally to all members of Salina Tech's community: students, faculty, staff, contract employees, volunteers, and campus visitors.

Victims and accused perpetrators of such crimes have legal rights and options available to them. Any member of the Salina Tech community (students, faculty, staff, contract employees, volunteers or campus visitors) who has experienced or knows of another member of the community who has experienced stalking, sexual assault, domestic violence or dating violence should immediately contact the Vice President of Student Services (785-309-3106) or the Office of Human Resources (785-309-3183). Both offices are located in Building A, first floor, 2562 Centennial Rd., Salina, KS 67401.

CLERY CAMPUS SECURITY AND CRIME STATISTICS ACT

CAMPUS CRIME REPORTING

Except in extreme circumstances, including but not limited to reporting stalking, sexual assault, domestic violence or dating violence, students and staff should notify a College administrator if the police department needs to be contacted. The administrator will place the call to the proper authorities. Once a College administrator has been contacted regarding suspicious acts, criminal actions or other emergencies occurring on campus, a warning report will be issued to members of the campus community in a timely fashion if administration and the appropriate authorities believe that the suspicious acts, criminal actions or other emergencies could place the campus community in danger:

- A. No later than the next scheduled day of classes if there is no immediate danger to the campus community or
- B. As soon as possible if there is imminent danger to the campus community.

Appropriate action may include notification to students and staff about the availability of on and off campus counseling, mental health, or other student services depending on the situation.

From 2013-2015 Salina Tech staff and students, including its Salina campus, at any other location where classes were held, on any adjacent public properties (including Salina Tech students living at or utilizing Kansas State Polytechnic Salina Campus) did not experience any murders, arson, aggravated assaults, hate crimes, or liquor law violations. In 2014, there was a drug abuse violations at a location where classes were held and weapon possessions at Kansas State Polytechnic Salina Campus. During this three-year period there were no forcible or non-forcible sex offenses, nor were there any reports of motor vehicle thefts.

Information is prepared annually and reported to the Department of Education in an annual security report. The three-year findings are compiled and published by mid October each year. After the publication is updated, it is distributed to all Salina Tech staff and students during student or staff orientation processes. Salina Tech also electronically distribute this information and any updates through our learning management system and via student and staff email. SAFETY

All College employees shall make all reasonable efforts to provide a safe environment for students, staff, and visitors. These efforts may include but are not limited to cooperation with law enforcement agencies and/or emergency response personnel.

The College Board and the President will cooperate with local governmental officials, emergency preparedness authorities and other related state and federal agencies to maintain adequate disaster warning systems and procedures. Applicable staff and/or maintenance personnel shall periodically inspect each building, and other appropriate areas to see that they are adequately maintained. Written records of these inspections shall be maintained.

Inspection of the College facilities for hazardous waste shall be conducted on a regular basis. Written records of these inspections shall be maintained. Hazardous waste that is discovered will be reported to the President and its removal and disposal shall be handled in accordance with applicable local, state, and federal rules and regulations. When hazardous waste material is produced in a shop or any location within the College, its disposal shall be in accordance with state and federal rules, regulations and current law.

The College policies are designed to insure students, staff and all property are protected at all times from possible damage or injury, outside intrusion or disturbances occurring on campus grounds or in campus buildings.

SECURITY

The College shall attempt to ensure that employees, students, visitors and property are protected from possible injury or damage. Security devices may be installed at locations deemed appropriate. Other measures may be taken to prevent intrusions, trespassing or disturbances from occurring on the College property. Outside lighting shall be installed at each building and other locations on campus to

provide illumination. The College shall cooperate with law enforcement in security matters.

Firearms are not allowed on college property. Kansas Statutes Annotated 21-4204 defines unlawful possession of a firearm as “(d) possession of any firearm by any person, other than a law enforcement officer, in or on any school property or grounds....” A student shall not knowingly possess, handle or transmit any object that can reasonably be considered a weapon.

ACCESS TO CAMPUS FACILITIES

Campus facilities are restricted to those who have a legitimate purpose for being on campus. Other persons will be asked to leave. Facilities will be secured and locked when classes are not in session. Locks and other security equipment to buildings and their contents are checked regularly. Door keys are issued sparingly to college personnel to maximize security.

The College will attempt, through its staff, to ensure that students, patrons and all property owned by the College are protected at all times from possible damage or injury, outside intrusion or disturbances occurring on campus grounds or in campus buildings. The College shall cooperate with all law enforcement agencies.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE & EVALUATION PROCEDURES

To immediately notify the campus community upon the confirmation of significant emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health or safety of students or employees occurring on the campus the College will assess the situation and use the appropriate system of communication to confer the information to staff and students. This may include but is not limited to electronic mail or social media, phone, or person-to-person communication.

Appropriate action may include notification to students and staff about the availability of on and off campus counseling, mental health, or other student services depending on the situation.

The College will, without delay, and taking into account the safety of the community, determine the content of the notification and initiate the notification system, unless the notification will, in the professional judgment of responsible authorities, compromise efforts to assist victims or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency. When informed of an emergency SATC administrative staff will determine who to notify, determine the content of the notification, and initiate the appropriate notification system—electronic, phone, or person-to-person.

Administrative staff include but may not be limited to any or all listed below:

- President
- Vice Presidents
- Directors

The President or a Vice President will disseminate emergency information to the larger community as appropriate.

The College will test the fire emergency response and evacuation procedures on at least an annual basis including publicizing its process in conjunction with at least one test per calendar year, and documenting a description of the exercise as well as the date and time of the exercise and whether it was announced or unannounced.

ON-GOING EDUCATION AND AWARENESS

Salina Area Technical College is committed to increasing the awareness of and prevention of violence. Salina Area Technical College makes continued efforts to provide students and employees with education programming, and strategies intended to prevent rape, acquaintance rape, sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking before they occur. To address the issue of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking in a college environment, Salina Area Technical College offers practical guidance for risk reduction, violence prevention, and bystander intervention.

New Student Orientation - Orientation programs addressing active bystander awareness, support services, medical amnesty, wellness, and personal safety are delivered by members of the Office of Student Services to first year and transfer students.

Employee Orientation - All new employees receive training on Sexual Harassment and Campus SaVE through the Office of Human Resources. All employees receive annual training during in-service.

Bulletin Board Campaigns - The Office of Student Services and Office of Human Resources work jointly to use passive programming strategies in the student lounges, classrooms, restrooms, and buildings to provide information on crime prevention and safety issues related to Salina Tech students and employees on and off campus.

Newsletters/Social Media - Safety awareness and reminders are sent throughout the year in employee newsletters, through a variety of social media methods and resources to reach students by posting videos, flyers, etc. Additionally, Salina Tech has subscribed to Student Health 101, a monthly on-line health and wellness magazine designed for college students. The magazine includes topics in connection to sexual assault, consent, sexual empowerment, and relationships.

LOCATIONS WITH REPORTABLE CRIME STATS

In 2014, Village Manor Nursing Home, 705 N Brady Street, Abilene, KS - Arrest for possession of opiate, opium, narcotic or certain stimulant on June 24, 2014. The College held a class at this location between May 28, 2014 and July 16, 2014.

In 2014, Kansas State Polytechnic Salina Campus, 2310 Centennial Road, Salina, KS - Reported Burglary. Through an agreement, Salina Area Technical College students are allowed to enter into contracts with Kansas State Polytechnic Salina Campus for use of residential living (dorms).
