


Salina Tech will provide COVID updates on Tuesday and Thursday each week. Updates will include new positive cases within the College since the earlier update and updated Saline County numbers. All students and employees exposed to a positive case at Salina Tech will be notified by their local health department and/or Salina Tech.


The College works closely with area health departments when notifying students of exposure to a COVID case and quarantine requirements. Students and employees will receive communication directly from their county health department on what guidelines they need to follow.

The College will preserve the privacy of all students and employees who are either positive for COVID or have been exposed.
